Wu Liang Shrine Ancient Chinese

The Wu Family Shrines (Chinese: 武氏祠; pinyin: wǔ shì cí), of which the Wu Liang Shrine is the best known, was the family shrine of the Wu clan of the Eastern Han dynasty. The shrines contain a vast amount of relief carvings. Three walls of Wu Liang's shrine were still standing as late as the 11th century, which is the reason that the site of all the family shrines are often called after him.

The funerary shrine of the Confucian scholar Wu Liang, created in AD 151, is the most important surviving pre-Buddhist monument in China. That is to say, it is the most important single work of visual art from the centuries that set the patterns of Chinese thought for almost two millennia.

The Wu Family Ancestral Shrine lies in the north of Wuzhai Mountain in Zhifang Township, Jiaxiang County of Shandong Province. Built in the east Han era, the shrine was built entirely in stone. During the end of Qing dynasty and the early national government period, a handful of portraits and building stones from the graves of the Wu clan were shipped overseas.

Wuhou Temple, also known as Wuhou Shrine Temple of Marquis, is dedicated to Zhuge Liang, the Marquis Wu (Wuhou) of the Kingdom of Shu in the Three Kingdoms Period (220 - 280). Zhuge Liang was an excellent politician, militarist, diplomat and astronomer.
