(Applause Books). Following his highly successful *An Askew View: The Films of Kevin Smith* (Applause), John Kenneth Muir now turns to the life and work of legendary cult-film director Sam Raimi. Raimi exploded on the movie scene in 1982, when he was 23 years old, with the audacious, independently produced horror film *The Evil Dead*. Re-igniting the horror genre to such a degree that Wes Craven credited Raimi on-screen in *A Nightmare on Elm Street*, Raimi went on to direct two *Evil Dead* sequels, his own comic-book superhero, *Darkman*, and an over-the-top, post-modern western, *The Quick and the Dead*. His complete oeuvre also includes three books of poetry, a play, occasional journalism, and his published letters.
