Investigating the Relationship Between the Watson-Glaser Critical Thinking Appraisal and the NEO-PI-R

ABSTRACT: This study investigated the relationship between two selection assessments - the Watson-Glaser Critical Thinking Appraisal and the NEO-PI-R. Both assessments were used in the selection process of professionals at a large real estate organization. This study researched if personality traits and critical thinking skills are two distinct entities, and if each assessment assessed different domains relating to successful job performance and job-fit. The results indicated that the two assessments were measuring two distinct constructs (personality and critical thinking). Although there was not a significant correlation between the factor Openness to Experience and the total score on the WGCTA, the results indicated that the O5 facet, Ideas, is significantly correlated with total scores on the WGCTA. Future research will be required to further investigate the relationship between the Openness to Experience factor and the ability to think critically.

Critical thinking is highlighted as a main learning outcome which college education aims at. This study validated the Watson Glaser Critical Thinking Appraisal (WGCTA) on a sample of 273 students from the American University of

Beirut's population. For that purpose, evidence for construct validation was gathered through investigating the differences in scores on the WGCTA between students from different genders (male- female), at different levels (freshman- sophomore/ 1 st year- junior/ 2 nd 4 th year and graduate) and from different streams (nursing- engineering- year-senior/ and business) using a series of ANOVA tests. Evidence for content and arts-sciences concurrent validity was also collected by means of computing the test's reliability coefficient as well as standard error of measurement and correlating some students' scores with their scores on the critical thinking component of the Collegiate Assessment of Academic Proficiency CAAP. Moreover, students in five chosen courses that emphasize critical thinking as a learning outcome were pre- post tested using the WGCTA. Results revealed no significant differences in scores on the WGCTA between male and female test takers or between students at different levels except for graduate students and the rest of the levels, in favor of the graduate students in the Business stream. Furthermore, results revealed significant differences for the senior students between Engineering and Sciences as well as Business students (in favor of Engineering students), and between Nursing and Business students (in favor of Nursing students). Finally, results showed no statistically significant changes in the mean scores of students who were pre and post tested in the five chosen courses except for nursing students whose mean score decreased. The test was also found to correlate positively with the Critical Thinking subtest of the CAAP ($r = 0.64$) The results were discussed and explained in terms

of the effects of training and effective instructional strategies on growth of critical thinking but also of the nature of the construct itself. Recommendations for future research were proposed.

Process on the Critical Thinking Skills of High School Students

The purpose of the research reported here was to determine the impact learning the engineering design process (EDP) would have on the critical thinking skills of high school physics students. An EDP unit was conducted with 5 classes of high school physics students in grades 10-12 over 1 month. The EDP unit's curriculum allowed for the gradual release of responsibility as students became more familiar with the EDP and more consistent in using it. The six steps used in this EDP unit were Ask, Imagine, Plan, Create, Test, and Improve. The Watson-Glaser Critical Thinking Appraisal was given as a pre- and post-test to measure the growth in critical thinking skills. By measured standards, qualitative analysis and observation, students showed an increase in critical thinking skills and in confidence to use them.

No statistically significant differences were found between the groups in either American history or critical thinking. Differences in critical thinking ability, though not significant statistically, seemed to indicate the

desirability of further research in this area. It was also recommended, as a result of this study, that further research be conducted to develop and evaluate new methods of assessing student competence in seminar situations.
