Not only has Stanley Kubrick acknowledged that Furie's *The Boys in Company C* (1978) informed and influenced *Full Metal*

Jacket (1987), but Martin Scorsese has said that he considers *The Entity* to be one of the scariest horror films of all time. However, Furie was often later criticized for accepting lowbrow work, and as a result, little serious study has been devoted to the director. Meticulously researched and enhanced by Kremer's close relationship with the filmmaker, this definitive biography captures the highs and lows of an exceptional but underexamined career, taking readers behind the scenes with a director who was often ahead of his time.

In the summer of 1965, the Los Angeles neighborhood of Watts exploded in a

race riot that spanned six days, claimed thirty-four lives, and brought America's struggle with racial oppression into harrowing relief.
